Professor Emeritus and Founding Faculty Director of the Yale Center on Climate Change and Health, Yale School of Public Health



Rob has been on the faculty at the Yale School of Public Health since 1987. He is now Professor Emeritus and mostly retired. Previously, he had been heavily involved in the educational mission of the school, including teaching required core courses in epidemiology, serving as the school's inaugural Associate Dean for Academic Affairs from 2007 to 2010, and winning the School's Distinguished Teaching Award in 2002, 2007, and 2012. For much of his career, Rob's research focused on cancer, HIV, and their interaction, including several studies on lung cancer. However, in 2015, moved by what he sees as the greatest public health challenge of our time, he committed himself to a new direction in the field of climate change and health, and became Founding Faculty Director for an initiative that grew into the Yale Center on Climate Change and Health, for which he served as Faculty Director until 2025, when he passed on leadership to a younger colleague.

Rob's climate change and health research has focused on adverse health effects of heat and air pollution. In addition, he is a collaborator on a project to establish an early warning system for dengue in the Mekong Delta Region of Vietnam. He also has interests in the benefits and harms of air conditioning, in climate change and health in the Caribbean, and in health equity issues as they relate to climate change and air pollution.

Rob strongly supports the ALA Connecticut chapter's public policy goals of creating a tobacco-free future, improving the quality of life for those with lung disease and their families, defeating lung cancer, and championing clean air for all. Having devoted the past 11 years of his professional life to understanding and addressing the adverse health effects of climate change and air pollution, he has a special passion for achieving clean air for all.
