

Nebulized Therapy



You may benefit from nebulized therapy

A nebulizer is a machine that turns liquid medicine into a breathable mist. Nebulizers deliver medication deep into your lungs to treat asthma, COPD and other chronic lung diseases. This helps ensure you are getting a full dose of medication, so you can feel better and breathe more easily.

Nebulizers come in different sizes and are often covered under your health insurance.

Stationary nebulizers are placed on top of a table and require electricity to work properly. In the event of a power outage, you will need a power source like a generator for it to work.

Portable nebulizers are smaller and lightweight. They can be charged with batteries or your car, making them ideal for travel or in situations where there is a power outage.





Talk to your healthcare provider if you think a nebulizer is right for you. Together, you can review your lung disease medication, discuss your treatment plan and determine if nebulized therapy is the best option for you.
