Her training is at Norwalk Hospital in Connecticut and Yale New Haven Hospital. Specialists in pulmonary medicine care for patients with lung disorders and assist general practitioners with managing difficult, unusual or complicated diseases of the respiratory system. Her critical care training includes a wide array of clinical problems, not only complex respiratory disorders, at the extremes of human disease. She is passionate about improving access to lung cancer screening and continuing to promote smoking cessation embracing the American Lung Association's Healthy Air Campaign. Jane Reardon seemed destined to make a difference for people with lung disease. After graduating from nursing in 1966, she worked in a respiratory intensive care unit where she noticed that the same patients coming in over and over.

“I’m thinking, what’s going on? Why do these people keep coming back?” she said. Jane soon realized that a major reason was a lack of resources for patients and their families. With help from the American Lung Association Connecticut chapter, Jane and other nurses wrote a book to help those living with lung disease.

Jane then earned her Master’s in Pulmonary Nursing from Yale and was recruited to start the first pulmonary rehab program in Connecticut. Since then, Jane has remained committed to improving lung health, most recently advocating for others to join her in making a legacy gift to the American Lung Association. In the past, she has even put her baking skills to work making her famous chocolate chip cookies for every National Board member who joined the Legacy Society.

Jane has served on the Lung Association’s Connecticut Leadership Board for many years, including a term as Chair, and previously served on the National Board of Directors and as Chair of the Northeast Board.
